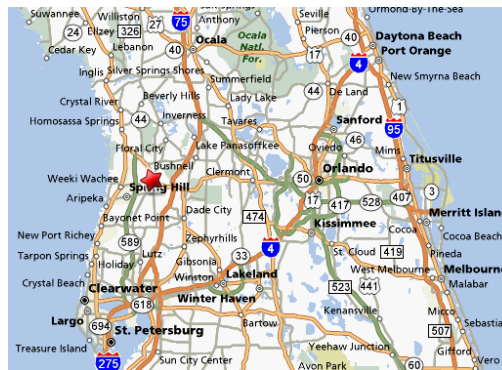
Making the Plank (and other fun activities)...

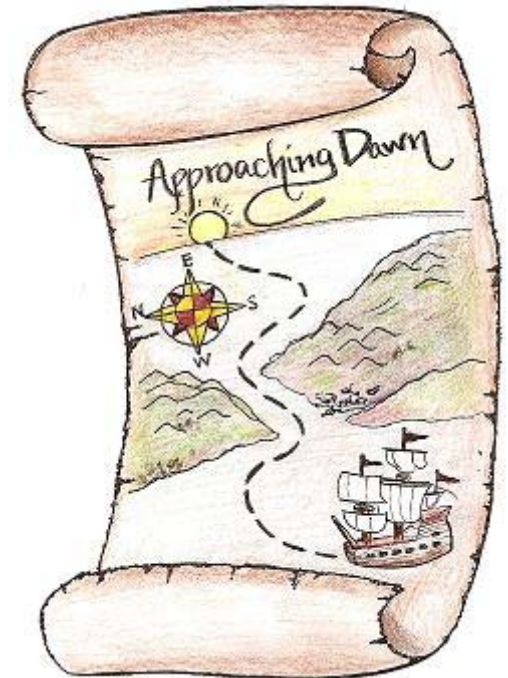
