RYC Roles

Counselors

The Counselors are the camper encouragers of RYC. Their primary responsibility is to interact with the campers, building relationships, and aiding the campers' personal and spiritual growth at RYC. Counselors spend the majority of their time with the campers, experiencing RYC along with them. Each Counselor is assigned a group of campers, and spends the week in the cabin with those students. There are also designated times for the Counselor to meet with their campers in a Small Group setting. During the Small Groups, the Counselor leads a discussion about the Main Speaker's lessons and other aspects of camp and life. The Counselors are also fully engaged in Team Competitions and Tournaments with both the campers in their small group and from their church. As they eat, sleep, play, and pray with the campers, they have the opportunity to impact the campers' lives for Christ.

The Director oversees the Counselors. Also, a head guys and girls counselor may be designated so that Counselors may benefit from their experience and go to them with questions. This position is primarily in the middle of it all, fully involved with the campers. Oftentimes Counselors are purposefully as clueless as the campers concerning the inner workings of RYC, so that games and skits surprise them too. Many different types of people can make great Counselors, and experience is a great benefit, but it is not necessarily required. Overall, this role does require a heart for students, contagious enthusiasm, and a level of maturity to lead both practically (get them there on time) and spiritually (Small Groups).

If you would love to share your life with the campers, this may be a great way for you to serve the campers at RYC.

Games Guys *(No, you don't have to be a "guy" for this role)*

The Games Guys are the fun imaginers of RYC. Their primary responsibility is running the activities of the conference and creating fun wherever they go. They spend the majority of their time preparing, setting-up, running, and cleaning-up games, tournaments, and other group activities. In Large Group meetings, Games Guys may help lead a dance, get the room pumped up, or take part in a skit. Games Guys are also expected to make Wal-Mart supply runs, life-guard by the pool, oversee nightly security, and assist the Director and Assistant Director as needed.

Games Guys report to the Games Guys Director. For those involved in the skit, meetings prior to RYC are required. This position is both in the spotlight (skits) and behind the scenes (filling water balloons). It is necessary at times for the Game Guys to miss aspects of the conference in order to prepare for the next event, and they tend to be less involved with the campers.

If you love creating fun, tend to be a little crazy, and would like to experience RYC from behind the scenes, this would be a great way for you to serve the campers at RYC. .

Production Team (PTs)

The PTs are the magic makers of RYC. Their primary responsibility is to make it happen before the campers realize it should have happened. They spend the majority of their time handling administrative tasks, supporting the staff, and working with music and media productions. It can be hard to define because they are tasked with filling in the gaps and working out issues as they arise. A list of common PTs tasks is as follows:

1. Music Master – Makes sure music is playing at key times such as, before and after Large Meetings and during Team Competitions.
2. PowerPoint Person – Operates PowerPoint for photo slideshows and worship times.
3. Media Editor – Edits video for skits and creates daily photo slideshows
4. Photographer – Captures video and still shots throughout the week
5. Food/ Water Coolers – organizes and prepares evening snacks and keeps water coolers full
6. Registration – works registration table
7. Environment Creator – Decorates and sets-up Large Group Meeting room as needed.
8. Staff support – Handles any special requests of the Staff, in particular the Speakers, Musician, and Nurse
9. Cabin Maintenance – Handles any maintenance requests (more TP, towels, etc.)
10. Stage Manager – Make sure mics and other stage items are in place. For an example: things for the skit.
11. Gap Fillers – Assists Director, Game Guys, and all aspects of RYC as needed.

The PTs report to the Assistant Director. This position is primarily behind the scenes, however, a PT may be needed to take part in a skit. It is necessary at times for the PTs to miss aspects of the conference, and they tend to be less involved with the campers. PTs are always busy magically doing whatever it takes to make camp seem seamless.

If you prefer to be out of the limelight and have administration or media skills, this may be a great way for you to serve the campers at RYC.
